

Fact Sheet on Weill Cornell Medicine Belfer Vaccination Site

To support our community in the COVID-19 vaccination effort, beginning March 22, 2021 Weill Cornell Medicine, began offering appointments to eligible patients for the COVID-19 vaccine at the Belfer Research Building at 413 E 69th Street in New York City.

WHO CAN BE VACCINATED AT THIS SITE?

- At this time, New York residents 16 and older may obtain the vaccine at this site. People who live outside of the state but work or study in New York are also eligible to get vaccinated. People who are eligible based on employment include both paid and unpaid workers.

Note: People who are 16 or 17 years old are only eligible for the Pfizer vaccine.

WHEN WILL VACCINATIONS BEGIN?

- Appointments began on March 22, 2021.

WHERE IS THE BELFER RESEARCH BUILDING LOCATED?

- The Belfer Research Building is located at 413 E 69th Street in Upper East Side between 1st Avenue and York Avenue. The Belfer Site is accessible via the Q and 6 trains. The train stop for the Q train is 72nd Street and the 6 train is 68th Street.
